

The Copy of the
Charter of men of Tresford
in English given in
the Year 1573

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To all Christian People to whom these
Presents shall come to be seen or heard Robert by divine
Permission Bishop of Winton sendeth greeting in our Lord
everlasting Whereas our Burrough and Town of New Alresford
in the County of Southampton at present is in great decay and
Poverty whereby the Markets and Fair and the use of Merchandise
and Artificers in the same Town heretofore there used is now
discontinued and out of use in which things we are willing as
much as in us lieth to grant our Help and Remedy to the
Inhabitants of the said Town.

Know ye therefore that I the aforesaid Bishop to have granted
and for us and our successors for ever to have ordained that for the
future there may be and shall be forever within our Town and
Burrough of New Alresford aforesaid one Bailiff and eight chief
Burgesses of the better and more ^{honest} inhabitants of our Town and
Burrough aforesaid in Form hereafter specified to be chosen and
instituted for the good Governance and Ruling of the Burrough
and Town aforesaid and Inhabitants of the same and for the
Execution of this our Will and Grant in this behalf We do assign
nominate constitute and make and for us and our successors do by
these presents assign nominate constitute and make our beloved in
Christ John Heather one of the Inhabitants of the Town and
Burrough aforesaid to be the first and Chief Bailiff of the Town and
Burrough aforesaid Willing that the said John Heather in the
Office of Bailiff of the said Town and Burrough shall be and
continue from the Date of these Presents until the Feast Day of
Saint Michael the Archangel next coming and from that day
until one other Burgess of the Burrough and Town aforesaid to that
Office shall be preferred and chosen according to our ordinance and
Provisions hereunder expressed and specified if the said John
Heather shall so long live Else we assign nominate constitute
and make and for us and our successors do assign nominate
ordain constitute and make by these presents our beloved in
Christ Roger Sock, Phillip Rose, Thomas Allen, Richard
Beard, Henry Hockley, Richard Chepshaw, Sanceler Cook, and

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Henry Sunway Burgesses and Inhabitants of the Burrough and
Town aforesaid to be the first and chief ruling Burgesses and
Counsel of the Burrough and Town aforesaid so to be continued
in the said Office so long as they shall behave themselves well
in the said Office And further we will and for us and our
Successors by these Presents grant to the aforesaid Burgesses of
the Burrough and Town aforesaid and to their Successors
that the aforesaid chief Burgesses and Counsel of the Burrough
and Town aforesaid for the time being or the major Part of them
from time to time and at all times for ever hereafter have and
shall have Power and Authority yearly in the Month of
August (viz) on Monday next before the Feast of Saint Bartholemew
the Apostle to chuse and nominate one of themselves who shall
be Bailiff of the Burrough and Town aforesaid for one whole Year
then next coming in manner and Form abovesaid and that
after he shall be so preferred elected and nominated to be Bailiff
of the Burrough and Town aforesaid before he shall be admitted
into his Office he shall take his Corporal Oath in full Court at
the Turn or view of Frank Pledge of the said Lord Bishop
and his Successors to be next holden within the Burrough
aforesaid after his said election before the Steward of the said Lord
Bishop and his Successors well and truly to execute the said Office
And that after he hath taken such Oath the Office of Bailiff of the
Burrough and Town aforesaid shall hold and possess for one
whole Year next following the Monday next after the Feast of
Saint Michael the Archangel after such Election And further
we will and for us and our Successors do by these presents grant
to the aforesaid Bailiff and Burgesses of the Burrough and
Town aforesaid and to their Successors that if it shall
happen the Bailiff of the Burrough and Town aforesaid at
any time within one Year after he shall be preferred and sworn
as aforesaid to the Office of the Bailiwick of the Burrough and
Town aforesaid shall die or be removed from his Place that then
and so often it shall be lawful for the aforesaid chief Burgesses
and Counsel of the Burrough and Town aforesaid for the time being
or the major part of them to chuse and prefer one other of themselves
to be Bailiff of the Burrough and Town aforesaid and that he so

elect and prefered shall and may have and exercise that Office
during the residue of the same year having taken his Corporal
Oath in the Counsel House of the said Burrough before the
Bailiff of the said Lord Bishop and his Successors of his Bailiwick
of Sutton or him that holds his place and the aforesaid eight
Burghesses of the Burrough or Town aforesaid or the major part of
them within eight days after such Election and so often as the Case
shall so happen Also we will and for us and our Successors do by
these presents grant to the aforesaid Bailiff and Burghesses of the
Burrough and Town aforesaid and to their successors and we do
ordain that whensover it shall happen that any one or more of
the aforesaid eight Burghesses or Counsel of the Burrough or Town
aforesaid for the time being shall die or from his Place of Chief
Burghess or Counsel to be removed that then and so often it shall
and may be lawful for the Bailiff and other chief Burghesses or
Counsel of the Burrough and Town aforesaid as shall be then living
or remaining or the major part of them one or more others of the
honest and more better Inhabitants of the Burrough and Town
aforesaid in the Place or Places of the said Chief Burghess or
Chief Burghesses so dead or removed to chuse swear and prefer and
that he or they so elected and prefered shall first take his or their
Corporal Oaths before the Bailiff of the Burrough and Town aforesaid
before he or they shall be of the Number of the said eight Chief
Burghesses and Counsel of the Burrough and Town aforesaid and
then shall have and enjoy the like and such Power Authority and
Jurisdiction as the rest Chief Burghesses of the Burrough and Town
aforesaid ought to have and enjoy by virtue of these presents and
this so often as the Case shall happen Also we will and for us and our
Successors do by these presents grant to the aforesaid Bailiff and Burghesses
of the Burrough and Town aforesaid and to their successors that they and
their successors may have use hold and enjoy and may and shall have
use and enjoy for ever the Liberties Priviledges and Franchises
herein granted and specified as well within the Burrough and Town
of New Alresford aforesaid within the whole Territory and Precincts
of the Parish of New Alresford aforesaid (viz) that the Bailiff and
Chief Burghesses of the Burrough and Town aforesaid and their
successors for ever have and shall have all that our whole Fair to
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by held at New Alresford yearly on the Feast of the Ascension of our Lord
and all that our Fair at Alresford aforesaid likewise yearly to be held on
the feast Day of St John the Baptist and all that our free market
heretofore there of old held or to be held every week (viz) on Thursday as
of old the same hath been accustomed to be held in the town aforesaid
without any diminution and all Malling, Pickage, Controlling, and
correction of Weights and Measures of what kind soever and all other
Profits and Commodities of the same and the Court ~~and~~ Courts of
Tyrpowder to the said Fairs and Markets of right belonging and
appertaining together with all Profits and Perquisites of the same
and the Goods and Chattels of Felons, fugitives and Thieves taken
waved and strayed which shall happen within the Town and
Burrough aforesaid and the assay and assaying of Bread Beer and
Wine so that they ought to take the Bread at the House of the
Baker and that Bread to weigh and prove and to taste the Beer
through the whole Town and correcting of Bread and Beer unless
where the Baker ought to be condemned to the Pillory or the Brewster
to the Tumbrel or Pillory which we reserve to us and
our successors And all Tolls or Tolls which any manner of Way
may happen within the Precincts aforesaid Also the shedding of Blood
together with Arrements and Pains of the same Also of all and
singular the Premises And also quiet Claim of all Suits of Court besides at
two hundred or viii of such Fadge called Lawday to be held at New
Alresford aforesaid for us and our successors yearly and to be answered
the Chief Royalties with delay And that the aforesaid Burgesses and
Free Tenants of the Town and Burrough aforesaid their Heirs and
successors ought to do their proper Service at the Court Baron
to be held from three Weeks to three weeks within the Burrough
and Town aforesaid before the Baillif of the Burrough
and town aforesaid for the time being as our Baillif was wont
or accustomed to do and for the good Peace amongst the inhabitants
of the Burrough and Town aforesaid to be observed and kept for
future times for ever we will and grant for us and our successors
by these presents That the aforesaid Baillif and eight Burgesses and
their successors within the said Burrough and Town shall have and
enjoy Authority and free Power at the Court aforesaid within the
Burrough aforesaid to be held by the assent and consent of the Stewart of

of that Court and the major Number of the honest and more better Inhabitants of the Town aforesaid to make ordinances and constitutions amongst the artificers and other the Inhabitants of the Burrough and Town not contrary to the Laws and Statutes of this Kingdom of England for the common Good of the ^{said} Burrough and for prescribing and laying Pains and Forfeitures and them to levy by way of distress or other ways to be had, respect being had that they prescribe nor do any thing contrary to the Laws and Customs of this Kingdom of England And also that the said Burgesses and their successors may have all profits and Requisites of the Court Baron aforesaid And that the foresaid Bailiff and his successors by himself or his sufficient deputy ought to make attachments and all summonses Distresses and Executions which shall happen or hereafter ought to happen within the Burrough and Town aforesaid excepting those which concern the Bailiff of our Liberty And also excepting and always reserving to us and our successors

The Things levied by Rues and Cries and Lands and Tenements whatsoever of Felons and Fugitives condemned in outlawry and put in excheat and the escheats of all their Lands and Tenements whatsoever, Mails, ~~messages~~ and Reliefs if any be and except these Lands and Tenements in Alresford aforesaid which Thomas Wood holds of us by Indenture for Term of Years and all Royalties as well in Lands as in Waters within the Precincts and Territories aforesaid And all these Things aforesaid as it is aforesaid (except before excepted) We will and for us and our successors as much as in us lieth do grant by these presents to the aforesaid Bailiff and Burgesses of the Burrough and Town aforesaid To have hold use and enjoy to the aforesaid Bailiff Burgesses ^{and their successors} without any det or Contradiction of any of our Ministers whatsoever for ever To be held of us and our successors in Fee Farmy remunerating therefore yearly to us and our successors the ~~ancient~~ Rent of Fifteen Pounds fifteen shillings six pence and one Farthing of good and lawful Money of England at the Feast of Saint Michael the Archangel at our Exchequer at Woolsey of old aue and payable unto us of the Burrough and Town aforesaid And for Pickage and Stallage of the Fairs and Markets aforesaid yearly to us and our successors twelve shillings at the Feast aforesaid by the Hlands of

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of the Bailiff of the Burrough and Town aforesaid to be paid at our Exchequer aforesaid And moreover we will and for us and our successors do grant to the aforesaid Bailiff and Burgesses of the Town aforesaid and to their successors That the aforesaid Bailiff and his successors shall be our collector of all our Rents Due and to be due to us and our successors within the Burrough and Town aforesaid And that they may have and exercise the Office of Prepositor or Chief within the Burrough and Town aforesaid And further we ordain and constitute him the said John Heather Chief Bailiff and his successors Bailiffs of the Burrough and Town aforesaid to be our Prepositors Chiefs or Reeves within the Burrough and Town aforesaid at all times hereafter for ever Nevertheless so long as they from time to time do make a full and lawful account to us and our successors at our Exchequer at Woolsey aforesaid of all rents and other Profit yearly upon that ~~account~~ well and truly do pay In Testimony whereof to this present writing we have put our seals Dated the tenth day of December in the Year of the Reign of our Lady Elizabeth by the Grace of God of England France and Ireland Queen Defender of the Faith &c the fifteenth and in the Year of our Consecration the twelveth #.
